NEW ZEALAND POLITICS

Course Description

New Zealand politics will be studied in the context of the history of New Zealand, and a comparison between the cultural values of New Zealand and the United States of America.

Course Outline

The course requires a commitment of 120 hours over a 36-week educational year.

Method

The learning in this course will be undertaken by reading the two primary resources, conducting research as required by the assessment questions, and completing the course assessment.

Resources

The primary resources will be:

- o The Penguin History of New Zealand, by Michael King
- o Fairness and Freedom: A History of Two Open Societies: New Zealand and the United States, by David Hackett Fischer

Other resources will be consulted as required.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, the student will have gained a sound understanding New Zealand's history and government system, as well as a comparison of the cultural values of New Zealand and the United States.

Assessment

Assessment will comprise three essays and an oral presentation, each contributing 25% to the final grade.
